Happy 75th Anniversary, Hendricks Avenue Baptist Church!

What a joy it is to celebrate with you seventy-five years of faithful, fruitful, beautiful ministry. This occasion has given me reason to reflect on the many ways you have blessed one another, your community, Florida's Cooperative Baptists, and, yes, the world. I found myself thinking about your children, many of whom I have known, who now serve as ministers and missionaries. Can there be better evidence of the grace of God residing in a church than that its children grow to know God's love and hear God's voice calling them to ministry?

Likewise, I found myself remembering the phone call I received that morning in December 2007 telling me that your sanctuary had burned to the ground. You've been generous in your giving and faithful in your praying. You've been our host for meetings and our partner in ministries.

NOTES ON OUR 75TH ANNIVERSARY HYMN WORDS AND MUSIC BY REV. THOMAS M. SHAPARD

"A People of Grace," a hymn written in October 2021 to honor the 75th anniversary of Hendricks Avenue Baptist Church, seeks to capture the ethos of the congregation in three verses that reference the past, present, and future seasons of HAB, respectively. The first stanza points to the church's original statement of purpose in 1946, calling for "a house of prayer, a spiritual democracy, a place of comfort for the sorrowing, of spiritual rest for the weary, and a haven of hope for the discouraged." The second stanza references the difficult realities of church life, in general, but alludes specifically to the 2007 sanctuary fire and the congregation's outward turn to embrace a community that embraced the church during a time of great need—an event that still inspires much of our mission today. The final stanza highlights the value placed on education in all aspects of congregational life over 75 years, but especially as HAB now discerns the future through the same creativity and playfulness that has accompanied our children and youth ministries, HACAA (Hendricks Avenue Community Athletic Association) and the church's historical recreation ministries, as well as the new horizons for Little Friends Preschool.

The title of the hymn is inspired by the often-used phrase, "A Place of Grace," to describe the congregation. While we can think of HAB as a location along Hendricks Avenue, a place for comfort and joy, I wanted to highlight in the hymn the importance of the people, a people formed by the grace of God and a people who return that grace to others on a daily basis.

As for the music, I set out to write a singable tune, one that is sturdy and quickly learned. A few interesting characteristics to highlight: The opening musical fragment of lines 1, 2, and 3 quote the congregational song "Make Me A Servant," a sonic-reminder of Jesus' command to love God and love neighbor, always. The tune name, SAN MARCO, refers to the name of the church's inaugural meeting place during the first years of the congregation's formation, the San Marco Theater. And finally, at the end of the third stanza, the intentionally misplaced emphasis of the word "Inspire" on beat two moves us toward the word "love" in the next measure. This is a playful way of reminding us that the nature of the Holy Spirit nudges us—sometimes uncomfortably shifting us—toward love.


