



Senior Adult Luncheon by Joe Stepp, Diaconate Chair

The church has a new mission partner—<u>Jacksonville Young Lives</u>. Young Lives exists for expectant and parenting adolescents to grow in faith, grow in life, and grow in leadership. The ministry offers mentorship, educational support, and spiritual guidance to help youth

navigate life challenges, build resilience, and develop a strong sense of purpose. All this is done by offering fun, but life-changing, experiences.

YoungLives representatives, including volunteers, donors, board members, and staff, go where the girls are by visiting schools, hospitals, and foster homes. The focus is particularly on those girls that are in vulnerable situations such as poverty, neglect, or social isolation. Many of the girls have heartbreaking stories and need positive people around them to show love.

How can you help? YoungLives needs *volunteers* to help provide food for monthly clubs, provide childcare for monthly clubs, and mentors to meet consistently with teen moms and pour love into them. If you are not able to volunteer, you may wish to consider a *one-time or ongoing financial donation*. The current goal of YoungLives is to have 30 people give \$30 a month.
