

# Britt Hester, Associate Pastor for Community Life and Spiritual Formation



There are few words in the English language as slow, unhurried, and gentle as saunter. It does not imply rushing, striving, or trying to prove oneself. Instead, to saunter is to walk with ease, to

move with presence, to step into the world with calm confidence rather than frantic urgency. For our youth ministry theme this year, we have chosen Saunter as a way of describing how we hope to live and walk together in a world filled with chaos, violence, and confusion.

At first glance, saunter might sound out of place in our current moment. The world tells us to hurry up, get ahead, and stay busy. News headlines overwhelm us with tragedy and division. Social media pushes us toward comparison and competition. In such an environment, a slow and gentle pace might seem irresponsible, even naïve. Yet, the way of Jesus consistently challenges the world's expectations. Jesus never seemed rushed. He traveled from town to town, pausing to listen, to heal, to eat with strangers, and to notice those everyone else overlooked. His life was defined not by frenzy, but by trust in God's timing.

To saunter in the way of Christ doesn't mean ignoring the pain of the world. In fact, it means opening our eyes wider. When we walk humbly, we can notice those who are hurting. When we move gently, we create space for kindness and compassion to emerge. When we resist the pressure to rush, we open ourselves to the Spirit's interruptions. Sauntering is not passive. Rather, it is an act of trust. It is a choice to earnestly believe that God is in control, even when the world around us seems to spin out of control.

For our students, this way of walking may feel countercultural. School, sports, friendships, and plans all demand energy and

urgency. Many of them carry the weight of expectations: grades to earn, teams to join, colleges to apply to, reputations to uphold. The message often received is that your worth depends on your speed, productivity, or popularity. But what if your worth was already secure? What if you could live from a place of deep trust rather than anxious striving? This is what it means to saunter with God.

As a youth group this year, we are committing ourselves to this slower, more humble, more attentive walk. We will study Scripture not as a checklist but as an invitation to listen. We will serve not out of obligation but out of love. We will gather in fellowship not to impress one another but to remind each other of grace. We will practice walking gently through a world that is anything but gentle, and in doing so, bear witness to the hope that God is always with us.

FORTIAL SUITS ALL

So, when you hear the word saunter, let it remind you of Jesus' invitation: "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light" (Matthew 11:28). May this year be one where our students, leaders, and families learn to walk not in panic but in peace, not in fear but in trust, not in haste but in love. We hope you will join us!



Fiscal year September 2025- August 2026








